One of the couples who participated in the group trip to NLAI Kenya this winter writes:



Our trip to New Life Africa International in Nakuru was all in all a fantastic trip. Our "normal" Danish way of thinking, attitudes, and opinions were put on hold, and we will never be the same again. We came to a place that gives children and young people hope and faith. Faith in themselves and faith in Jesus. They are happy and free during the time they are at school where they are safe and secure, receiving love, food, and schooling. On arrival the children, who are to live in the boys' house and the girls' house, are greeted by a Social worker, in a fantastic office. She is an exceptional woman who is very warm-hearted and open. The room is also inviting and warm. Well qualified "parents" also help the children to feel welcome and to settle. This is very important as they often come from very difficult backgrounds. There is always time for hugs, conversation, food and love. The children are helped in such a way that their self-esteem begins to improve. These children have experienced things that no one should experience yet, seem so happy and grateful, well-educated and respectful.



In the NLAI school, there are between 40 – 50 students in every class with 1 class teacher, and it works well. They are students who know how lucky they are to be there. They want to learn and have a strong desire to get an education and get away from the slums. We saw children from the landfill who live in garbage and filth when not in school. This is something that is hard to imagine but we have been there and seen it with our own eyes. The children are grateful for the help, care, food and teaching they get

at the "Tumaini" school, and other schools where they are supported by NLAI and they are happy. We were allowed to visit the school and stay with the children. They played, sang, and performed for us. We saw a school that is built on faith with a school administration and staff of teachers who share faith, hope and love with the children. In addition, we visited the Sewing School, which currently has

71 students. The school has a fine reputation in large parts of Kenya. Again, at the sewing school the students showed respect, an admirable attitude to work/

school, as well as a sound human perspective. This makes it relatively easy for the graduates to find work after graduating from school. The work they do is fantastic.

This work of NLAI which started under a tree about 30 years ago, has been blessed by God, so today NLAI provides food and schooling,



as well as further education for 986 students at NLAI's schools and other schools and educational institutions. Please pray for the work. Thank you for the trip and the fantastic experiences.

Susanne and Leif write



We and our family are doing well, and we look forward to welcoming our 12th grandchild by the end of May 2025.

But first we are looking forward to gathering as a family this Easter, where we all will meet for a few days here in

Aalborg except for our son and his family in South Africa. Our family means a lot to us and when they are doing well, we rejoice with them. When they face challenges, we share in their challenges just as they share in our afflictions when we are affected.

Unfortunately, **our daughter Louise** had some transient blood clots in her brain in the fall of 2024 and was on sick leave for a long period.

We are grateful to God that she very quickly was treated with blood-thinning medication that prevented the blood clots from causing serious damage. She was also treated with heart rhythm regulating medication due to atrial fibrillation that caused the blood clots.

Louise has now started work and will soon be working full-time again.

Susanne's back problem

As mentioned in the last newsletter, Susanne suffered a herniated disc last summer.

There has been a long period with strong painkillers and when the time approached for the group trip to Kenya in February, we were still not sure whether Susanne would be able to travel with us.

We prayed a lot of prayers for Susanne that her back would be stabilized so that the insurance company would permit her to travel.

Just 3 weeks before departure, after a stable period in her back for a few months, Susanne had a green light from the doctors and the insurance company to travel with the group to Kenya.

The long flights and occasional long drives on bad roads have not worsened the back problems and her back is still progressing with less and less pain, so we are very grateful.



Group trip to Kenya

From February 22 to March 13, 2025, we went on a group trip to Kenya with 31 people in total, of whom we only knew a few in advance. The trip was fantastic, and we got to know many new people, who also took interest in the work being done in Kenya through New Life Africa International.

We went around all the classes at the school, visited the children at the two orphanages and took part in various events with the children and young people. We also attended a big party with the participation of all the children from the orphanages as well as the staff and all the guests. We were about 180 people.

The whole group of travelers also went to the landfill and saw the terrible lives of the people out there.



They visited the kindergarten close to the landfill, where the children from the area go to school and get away from their homes with poverty, alcoholism and violence and hopelessness. It makes you think many thoughts and you become grateful for the good conditions we have in Denmark.

When we came to church on Sunday morning the children and the young people filled the whole program.

Several of the former residents from the orphanage came with their spouses and children and gave testimonies and praise to God and people.



The preacher was a young man who had previously lived at the orphanage but now has a family and a good job as an insurance agent. He is also active in a church in Nairobi.

5 new girls and 6 new boys moved into the orphanages from October 2024 – March 2025



39 new children started in PP1 New Life Africa International pre-primary school in January 2025, of which 12 students have been given a sponsor, while other 27 are still missing a sponsor.





51 new children started in PP1 in January 2025 in Tumaini Pre-primary School, of which 15 students have been given a sponsor, while 36 need a sponsor. There are still rich opportunities to help one of these wonderful little children. In
